



DEAG Deutsche Entertainment AG issues the following information regarding the *regulation of the Swiss Federal Council* of February 28, 2020, which bans public and private events involving over 1,000 people in order to prevent the spread of coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). The regulation came into effect immediately and lasts until March 15, 2020.

The ban affects only two DEAG events, which have been rescheduled upon agreement with the respective artists and will take place at a later date.

So far, there has been no impact on DEAG ticket sales or decline in demand due to coronavirus. There is extensive insurance coverage for damages caused when events are cancelled by civil authorities.

According to current information, DEAG does not see any threat to its events. The *epidemiology experts at the Robert Koch Institute* rate the public health risk in Germany currently moderate. The authority to cancel public events in Germany lies with the individual Federal States. The *health authorities at state level* make this decision on a case-by-case basis after thorough review. Currently there are no general bans on events or restrictions regarding events.

No plans to ban events exist currently in the UK. The *British Department of Health and Social Care* confirmed that a cancellation of major events is not under consideration.
